Target Group	Supervision Students and Staff
4 Criteria for Badge	Participants will broaden their theoretical and critical understandings of
	developing digital literacy(s) and 21st Century Skills.
	Participants will become familiar with a broad range of audio recording and digital editing (written/or audio) tools that can be used to record and disseminate information/project work/documentaries.
	Participants will develop and create a digital artifact.
	Participants will have a definitive set of digital skills that are applicable to further research/study/continuous professional development.
Short Description	The purpose of the "4 'C's"- 21st Century Skills Digital Badge is to allow learners to be recognized for their digital development in 21st Century skills. This badge uses the framework of 21st-century skills to underpin the exploration of new digital skills. The 4 "C's of creativity, collaboration, communication and critical thinking informs the learning process and enables learners to explore other 21st century skills such as information literacy, media literacy, technology literacy, flexibility, leadership, initiative, productivity and social skills.
